An exciting new possibility...

The Alpine Presbytery has initiated two New Mission Seedling Projects and wishes to begin a third based in the Eastern Suburbs of Christchurch. With support from Presbyterian Support Upper South Island, and St Andrews at Rangi Ruru we wish to appoint a full time explorer whose task is to listen and look, find out what God is doing and determine the best way of joining in. The position is for a fixed term of two years with the hope that new seedling(s) will then be taking root.

The person or persons who might fulfil this role will need

- ° an ability to self-manage and a high degree of resilience when times are challenging
- ° an ability to listen to and relate well with a wide range of people
- experience in working in bicultural/multi-cultural contexts

- ° a commitment to work with the people and ethos of Alpine Presbytery/PCANZ
- evidence of biblical and theological education and commitment to ongoing formation
- ° an ability to adapt and experiment

Whilst the name of the "from" person might be someone you know, a closer look at the email address will show that it is not correct.

The Gathering earlier this month was well attended and gave us a chance to update our Presbytery on activity in the last six months.

Our Moderator, Barry Ayers, led reflections based on two questions - 'How are you?', and 'How are we?', wondering if the old boat of the church is serving us very well, and noting the tension between the faith life and church life.

The PCANZ Moderator, Rt Rev Fakaofo Kaio brought greetings to the Gathering and shared some thoughts.

Closing of the Horrellville Church Rev Dr Don Fergus finished supply at Takaka and took up supply at St Martins Ordination of Rev Steve Talbot at Hope Sale of Trinity Church, Nelson Induction of Rev Edrick Corban-Banks at Akaroa-Banks Peninsula Retirement of Rev Joshua Choi – Korean Presbyterian Church in Christchurch Installation of Rev Su Hee (Steve) Bae as Interim Senior Pastor at Korean Presbyterian Church Christchurch Rev Dr Darryl Tempero seconded to KCML for a year Ordination of Rev Dr Michael Reid at Hoon Hay Rev Hamish Galloway formally appointed as the Minister at Cashmere Resignation of Rev Dennis Flett from Hope

The Very Rev Bruce Hansen was offered a gift as a marking of the 10th anniversary of the Christchurch Earthquakes and in recognition of his work over that period with the coordination, settlement process, and ongoing release of earthquake funds.

Alpine Council Reporting

The Executive Officer noted some main activities, the response to the Royal Commission on Abuse in Care, the East Christchurch/PSUSI new mission seedling initiative, the Boundaries and Conflicts of Interest paper and the Nominations process.

The proposal of Resourcing being a team within Alpine Council was approved.

Property & Finance Report:

The budget for the year ended 2021-22 was approved.

Ann McMillan presented a report (download here: Property and Finance Team report) outlining three main points (the report has information relevant to Parish Councils, property and finance personnel in parishes and we encourage you to read and take note of the items mentioned.)

Sharing:

Philippa & Ben Necklen reported on their experiences at Hanmer Springs; Martin Stewart provided a slide snapshot of the churches and ministries in Alpine; there was a report from the Alpine Mission Fund on the activities of over the last year; Rev Joohong Kim shared his research on 'Developing a mode of transcultural leadership in the English-speaking ministry context in New Zealand'; Josh Olds shared from his experiences in the Prestons New Mission Seedling; updates were given on ways we are forming circles of conversation and support in Alpine; Silvia Purdie shared some of the ideas about Eco Church that some people are wanting to take to General Assembly for approval; Lynmarie Sopoanga shared a story of the Kids Day event at Darfield, funded by the Have-a-Go fund.

The Andrew Norton Scholarship Recipients 2021 were announced as Jasmin Vanderwerff (Nelson) help with the costs of supervision training to enable her to offer better support for the young leaders she works with; and Abi Trevathan (Christchurch) - to help with the costs of undergoing part time study towards a Graduate Diploma in Theology at Laidlaw College with a specific focus on Indigenous Theology.

Step 3) April: Recycling

Bible verse: 1 Corinthians 15:50. What I am saying is this: flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God, nor does the perishable inherit the imperishable.

'Big Idea'

God designed all of Creation to be perishable, but modern manufacturing has created millions of objects that are effectively imperishable. Plastic is designed to degrade so slowly to be almost immortal. True immortality is found only in God. All else is idolatory. Objects that do not decompose harm the environment. Recycling reduces this harm.
