#### **Rev Ian MacGregor**

We have been advised of the death of Rev Ian MacGregor, who died peacefully surrounded by his loving family at Middlemore Hospital on 6 May.

Ian was born 30 January 1921 and died aged 100 years and four months. He attended the Theological Hall 1949-51 and was ordained at Otepopo-Kakanui, North Otago Presbytery on 1 February 1952. He resigned on 23 November 1954 to head overseas. On his return, he was called to Frankton, Hamilton in December 1957.

Ian was called to Rangiora in June 1967, and finally to Pukekohoe, South Auckland Presbytery in May 1978. He retired from here in January 1987.

Ian faithfully served the Presbyterian Church for nearly 70 years. He is remembered as a fine Christian man, with a firm Gospel-minded faith, and a very warm manner. We give thanks to God for Ian's faith, life and ministry.

We pray for Prue, and David and Elisabeth, Mary and Greg, and Rachel, and the grandchildren and great grandchildren.
