neglected art of lament. The retreat they attended was led by a student working towards a Doctorate in Theology, focussing on the art of 'lament'. Some of his studies looked at the lament psalms in scripture (Psalms 50-90) and Jesus' laments in the gospels, at the time of his crucifixion.

The practice of lamenting—of a healthy expression of our grief and a wide range of emotions, such as anger, frustration and pain—to God has been considered too sad or negative for the church so this practice has been neglected over many years. At the retreat we looked at songs, scripture and liturgy to find ways we could lament on behalf of the dying church, and in response to events in our lives and in the community, in the past and more recently.

The safe space for reflection will give you an opportunity to come, to grieve, express and engage with events in our lives using a variety of options, such as: writing, drawing, crafts, light a candle, pray, sing, cry, yell, sit quietly, or have tea or coffee.

This opportunity may be of interest to you, in light of recent local events and events you have experienced in the past that have significantly impacted on your life. The invitation is to come to a safe reflective space and practice the art of Lament.
