Order of Service Outline for Celebrating the Church Community

<u>Churches are not expected to use this service outline without modification</u>. Churches are anticipated to adhere to their customary liturgical format. <u>The hymns and prayers are suggestions only</u>. This outline simply offers ideas to help and encourage churches to run their own Lay Worship Month service involving as many members of their community as possible, while clergy or a lay member of the church's leadership team provides continuity.

Prelude: the community's musicians to provide music as a prelude to formal worship. If no musicians are available a YouTube clip could be played as a substitute, for example:

Call to Worship

Leader:

Brothers and sisters, what should we say then? When you come together, each of you brings something. You bring a hymn or a teaching or a message from God. You bring a message in another language or explain what was said in that language. Everything must be done to build up the church.

All your people God have been endowed with compassion, kindness that is a blessing for the community of faith. From among your people you have raised up individuals who have a heart to serve people less well off than themselves. Today we honour these people, thanking them for their contribution to the philanthropy of your church.

Today as a community of your people gathered to worship we acknowledge that the church is indebted to lay people who freely give of their time and their specialised skills in support of the work and worship of the church.

Today we honour every church member, thanking them for all the sacrifices they have made for your church. Amen.

Celebrate the Children

Acknowledge the important contribution children make to the church. This could be built around telling the stories of some of the young people who were used by God for God's purposes in Biblical times; for example Miriam keeping watch over her baby brother, Joseph the dreamer of dreams, Samuel hearing and responding to God's call, David confronting Goliath, Jeremiah being called to be a prophet when only a teenager, the twelve year old Jesus among the scribes at the temple in Jerusalem, the boy who contributed his lunch for the feeding of 5,000. Perhaps have a member of the congregation write a small (five minute) play retelling one of these stories and have it performed by the children.

Notices – the Life and Activities of the Church

Reading the Scriptures: In addition to, or in place of, one or more of the lectionary readings being used, have a member of the congregation read 1 Corinthians 12:4-26:

Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; ⁵ and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; ⁶ and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. ⁷ To

each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. ⁸ To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, ⁹ to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, ¹⁰ to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. ¹¹ All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

¹² For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. ¹³ For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.

Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many. ¹⁵ If the foot would say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. ¹⁶ And if the ear would say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. ¹⁷ If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? ¹⁸ But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. ¹⁹ If all were a single member, where would the body be? ²⁰ As it is, there are many members, yet one body. ²¹ The eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you," nor again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you." ²² On the contrary, the members of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, ²³ and those members of the body that we think less honourable we clothe with greater honour, and our less respectable members are treated with greater respect; ²⁴ whereas our more respectable members do not need this. But God has so arranged the body, giving the greater honour to the inferior member, ²⁵ that there may be no dissension within the body, but the members may have the same care for one another. ²⁶ If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honoured, all rejoice together with it.

Reading the Scriptures

Sermon
