Step 9) October: Cleaning

**Bible verse**: 1 Corinthians 8:9 *Be careful, however, that the exercise of your rights does not become a stumbling block to the weak.* 

'Big Idea': As Christians we try not to get caught up in lots of rules. Following Jesus is not about being 'good'. We are free to eat and to buy what we choose. However, as Paul warns us, not everything is good for us or good for those around us. Could our freedom damage the environment around us? The chemicals we use can have a destructive effect 'down-stream'. They are a 'stumbling block to the weak', not just people but fragile ecosystems and creatures.
