Notes from Presbytery Council meetings

July

In the absence of the Moderator, Rev Jon Parkes was asked to lead the meeting as Acting Chair.

Executive Officer:

Martin reported on Timaru Presbyterian's new kitchen opening, Rev Doug McConnell beginning in the St Andrew's NMS role, a report from Barry Helem of PSUSI on the East Christchurch Kaumatua Service, setting up the St Ninian's and PSUSI conversation about a possible collaboration plus presented several discussion papers:

- One year on reflection
- A vision for New Mission Seedlings in Alpine Presbytery on behalf of Resourcing and information about the
 possibility of Forge International becoming a partner in training New Mission Seedlings in conjunction with Alpine
 Presbytery, the Knox Centre and PressGo
- Future funding for our life & mission
- Some initial ideas regarding a possible Social Enterprise in Alpine Presbytery

Human Resources:

- Ministry Settlement Boards (MSBs) established at Plains St Ninians St Andrew's Ashburton, Hurunui and Hope
- Stated Supply agreement for Shona Bettany at Albury/Pleasant Point
- Hope Church application for a LOM position at Rolleston be approved

Property & Finance:

Waikari parish to complete three major items of upgrading/repairs on the hall at their 10 Allandale Road,
 Hawarden

Other matters:

- Mission Fund grants \$5,960 to the St Martins South Elder Care Day Programme
- Follow up started with St Martins re MSB matters
- Rev Sage Harris as Associate Minister at Whakatu be extended for a further two years to January 2024

August (via Zoom)

Rev Dr Andrew Nicol was asked to be the Acting Chair

Executive Officer:

Martin reported on his time in Greymouth, lockdown vibes, and the Canterbury Joint Regional Forum being disbanded.

- It was agreed that a Home Tidy Feasibility Study contract with GLG Consultants be approved in principle and an application for the costs of the study be made to the Alpine Mission Fund
- It is time to conduct the performance appraisal of the Resource Team Leader
- It was agreed that Alpine Presbytery confirm its agreement with the closure of the Reefton Union Church at 31 October 2020, the incorporation of the assets into the Greymouth Union Church, and the relevant church parties being informed

Human Resources:

- Jess Dreadon and Mark Ambundo authorised to conduct Baptisms in Hope Church.
- MSB in place for Cashmere Presbyterian Church to be disbanded as other options are looked at

Property & Finance:

- Kowai Parish application to sell their manse property at 3 Pound Street Amberley
- Kowai Parish application to purchase a replacement manse property (both applications approved in principle subject to Church Property Trustees sign-off)
- The formation documentation for Crossway Community Church was finalised

Resourcing:

- It was agreed that \$10,000 from the Resourcing Budget be committed to establishing Forge Aotearoa as an expression of Presbytery's investment in resourcing people operating in or interested in new mission seedling work in our life
- It was agreed that Presbytery Council apply for funding of \$30,000 from the Mission Fund for the stage 2 roll-out of the Pathways Programme

The resignation from Barry Ayers as Moderator was received and accepted with regret.

<u>September – Papanui</u>

Rev Barry Ayers (Moderator) conducted his last meeting in the role.

Barry expressed his appreciation for the support he has had in the role as he ponders retirement in a fuller sense. He noted that these are certainly 'interesting' days! Who would have thought that the wider world would have faced such a challenge? However, in the midst of the current challenge that faces us I do believe that there is a 'gift' of God as we see opportunities to re-shape and pivot our expression of *church* in our times. Surely, for Alpine especially, post-EQ days gave the church the opportunity to ponder and action changes to the way we *be church*. Did we take up that opportunity? Perhaps we have another window *now* to consider the same possibility once again. Will we seize that opportunity? Who will be courageous enough to grasp it?

Executive Officer:

Martin noted the following...

- General Anxiety in the community around issues that divide us, in particular some of the attitudes and conspiracies around Covid-19 vaccination, and some of that impact in the church community
- Linking in with Forge International in collaboration with PressGo, KCML & Central Presbytery
- A successful review of Presbytery Minutes (this is something that happens ahead of each General Assembly)

Human Resources:

- It was agreed that Rev David Coster be appointed Stated Supply Minister for 2 years at Cashmere Presbyterian Church on a half-time basis
- Council commended Rev Phyllis Harris on her Study Leave report *Given A Voice to Speak Breaking the Silence of Childhood Sexual Abuse*

Property & Finance:

- It was agreed that Alpine Council accept the Alpine Presbytery Annual Performance Report for the year ended 30th June 2021 and refer it to the full Presbytery for approval.
- Council recorded a vote of thanks to Christine Arnold for her excellent work as the Treasurer.

Putea Misioni Fund Report: Council approved the

- Feasibility Home Tidy Proposal application for \$24,260 plus GST
- Pathways Programme Yr 2 application for \$39,000
- The Mackenzie Cooperating Parish St Columba Community Hub Feasibility Study application for \$13,890 plus GST

Other matters:

- Council accepted the invitation to host the Special General Assembly meeting in April 2022.
- It was agreed that Rev Dr Andrew Nicol be appointed as Acting Moderator of Alpine Presbytery and the Presbytery members be notified and invited to endorse the appointment. The process for the election of a new Moderator who would commence in the role at the Autumn 2022 Gathering will take place in Nov/Dec 2021.
- Messages of thanks were conveyed to Barry Ayers for his leadership as Moderator. Comments included: his pivotal role in the formation of the culture of Alpine Presbytery; appreciation for the way he modelled taking time for people, listening, and offering wise advice; his personal qualities; the support of Clare; his challenging and interesting reflections; and his links with the Mid-Sth Canterbury cluster.

Karakia for our Climate

Karakia for our Climate is a youth led inter-church initiative calling the church in Aotearoa to pray about climate change. You are invited to join prayer vigils during COP26 (31st Oct - 12th Nov) both on-line and in person around Aotearoa New Zealand to pray for our global leaders and for God's creation.

The 2021 United Nations Climate Change Conference in Glasgow, known as COP26, is a meeting of approximately 200 world leaders and 30,000 delegates to drive ambition and action towards climate change. This meeting is crucial because the window to limit the impacts of global warming is rapidly closing. Some impacts such as sea level rise are already locked in for decades to come. The impacts of climate change will affect us all, but it will most directly impact low lying island nations, the most vulnerable in our communities and future generations.

This is a call for Christians across Aotearoa New Zealand to pray for climate action. Karakia for our Climate is holding

prayer vigils to pray for our global leaders to increase their ambition and commitment towards securing global net zero emissions by 2050 and keeping to 1.5°C degrees of warming. Join us as we pray for our global leaders, for climate justice, for humanity; for God's creation.
