Remembering Mike Riddell (Martin Stewart)

Rev Mike Riddell died in his sleep on Sunday at his home in Oturehua. He's been a mentor of a whole range of people across a broad landscape of New Zealand church and society. I doubt many people know of him, it's the nature of the guy not to seek the limelight even though he contributed quite significantly to the New Zealand cultural landscape. He was born and raised in Christchurch. His somewhat humble working class roots enabled him to connect and speak frankly in a range of contexts. The ministry of Ray Comfort brought about his conversion and led to his training as a Baptist pastor. His parish ministry context was in Ponsonby where he connected deeply with the plight of the homeless and mentally ill who were slowly becoming squeezed out of the suburb as central Auckland gentrified. From this experience he eventually wrote his first novel The Insatiable Moon. It was somewhat controversial not that Mike was overly concerned about that possibility. By the time it was published he had been teaching at the Baptist College for a number of years. The novel represented the final straw for the powers that be, and he was forced out of that role. He had also published a number of other books, he was a pioneer in the alternative worship movement and, though he wondered in his memoir whether anything really altered, a wide range of ministers were influenced by his insights including me.

He became a dedicated author, part-time lecturer at Otago University, and playwright/film maker. His play based around the last years of James K. Baxter's life was acclaimed at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival. *The Insatiable Moon* became an award winning movie, starring Rawere Paratene and Ian Mune. Rosemary, Mike's

wife, directed it. It is available on YouTube. Be warned though, there is a scene in it, though somewhat played down, that contributed to Mike's moving on from the Baptist world! It is a gorgeous movie!

Mike has continued writing poetry, essays, screenplays and articles for magazines, and has been instrumental in forming an annual writers' conference and writer's residency in Oturehua. The warmth of his welcome, hospitality, and his infectious laugh, coupled with his earthy spirituality, made him a special man in the lives of many – especially his family.

Anne and I shared a meal with Mike and Rosemary just two weeks before he died – Mike had been one of her theology lecturers. He gifted us a little book of poems about to be published. Here's the closing part of a poem called *Evening Thoughts*

'if this be my nightfall so be it

there will be peonies tomorrow immodest, brazen

forever opening to a dawn unseen'

Notes from the 24 March 2022 meeting of Presbytery Council, held on Zoom

The Moderator, Rev Phyll Harris, opened the meeting with devotions and prayer.

Devotions: Phyll reflected on a challenging situation involving death and injury in a car crash and how the provocative Philippians 4 text to 'give thanks in all things' can play out. Phyll observed that it is often amazing what one can find to give thanks for even in a calamity like this like, the doctor who was the first person on the scene, the others who turned up, the ability to get the hurt people to the right place for medical help, the support systems that kick in, and so on. Once the process of giving thanks is entered there can be a growing sense of God's presence in the midst of everything and more reason to trust God at work. Others shared things they were thankful for – many of them Covid-related. Phyll led a prayer 'Poor in Spirit' written by Joyce Rupp.

The Minutes of the Presbytery Council meeting held on Thursday 17 February 2022 were ratified.

Moderator

Phyll mentioned being on leave for three weeks and a minister with some health issues. A prayer was offered.

Executive Officer

Martin reported on a variety of aspects of his work and life including:

- Attending his aunt's funeral (including observing the church hosting the funeral breaching the Covid protocols! (Not Presbyterian!)
- Meetings with Kaikoura, Mackenzie, Presbyterian Support South Canterbury, St Margaret's. Various other meetings, planning for the Gathering, enjoying two weeks leave, and working on a team exploring a possible collaboration between Presbyterian Support and a Christchurch church.

Council agreed that Rev Phil Bettany continue to be a commissioner from Alpine Presbytery to the 2022 Special General Assembly given that he was a Commissioner in 2021.

- A letter inviting a different approach to how surplus church properties be handled was received from Hakatere Church. It was agreed to work with the parish about the issues raised.

Order of the Day 1: Alpine Mission Fund

- Peter Nelson, convener of the Alpine Mission Fund Board was associated with the
 meeting and discussed the view of the AMF that it was timely to review the
 purpose and parameters of the fund after six years of operating. Peter also
 indicated where Presbytery Administration costs rightly fall in the operating
 budget rather than in the Mission Fund grants.
- Council approved Peter Nelson and Martin Stewart working on the terms of reference for a small team to conduct a review of the purpose and parameters of the Mission Fund and report back in due course.

Order of the Day 2: St Andrew's Ashburton MSB

- Rev Dr Matthew Jack (convener), and Ross Thompson, Margaret Kelk, and Rev Eric Mattock were associated with the meeting. Matthew introduced people and referred to his written report.
- Council agreed that Rev Eric Mattock be called to be the Minister of St Andrew's Church, Ashburton, for a period of 2 years on standard terms of call with a 66.6% stipend.
- The MSB was thanked and discharged and the Moderator and EO work with St Andrew's to arrange the induction of Rev Mattock.

The next monthly Council meeting is scheduled for Thursday 28 April on Zoom.
