The Pathways Programme: Blenheim 9th June 2022

Pathways is a programme which offers intentional pastoral and spiritual care to individuals within congregations. Designed by Rt Rev Hamish Galloway and Dr Anne Shave, the programme provides opportunities for individuals to reflect on their stage of life, spiritual growth and areas of gifting and service. *Pathways* was successfully trialled at Cashmere Presbyterian Church during 2021 and is now being offered throughout the Alpine Presbytery.

What does it involve? Each participant:

- Has a one-to-one conversation with their minister or another church leader to explore 'where they are at' in terms of their stage of life, spiritual growth and areas of service
- Attends a full day seminar/retreat
- Has a follow-up one-to-one conversation aimed at exploring 'next steps'

"Taster days" for clergy and other church leaders have already been held in Christchurch and Ashburton and the programme is now up and running in several parishes in Canterbury. Clergy and church leaders from churches within the Nelson/Marlborough region and Kaikoura, who would like to experience the programme – perhaps with a view to introducing it to their own parishes – are now invited to attend a day to be held in **Blenheim on Thursday 9th June.** This programme is fully funded by the Alpine Presbytery.

Service Of Reflection For Ukraine, at the little Moana Community Church. One of the

organisers is a teacher at the Shantytown School, which hosts classes and engages children in older style teaching and learning methods such as slates and actual encyclopaedias, so they sent out a request and resource links to the local schools for contributions to the service and for display afterwards at the local library. We received pictures of sunflowers; poems about salt-dough sunflowers; and refugees; messages of welcome to Ukrainian children coming to New Zealand. Service material came from the Iona Community in Scotland; a hymn by Carolyn Gillette called We Pray For Peace, and, in recognition of the disproportionate impact on women and children, a hymn based on words from Isaiah 49 called A Woman's Care. People were there from range of different а denominations. A takeaway sheet had links to two Ukrainian recipes and to a number of organisations accepting and distributing donations for humanitarian aid for refugees, children, and families.

A 'Small church' conversation

As part of my study leave I hope to host a conversation open to anyone in Alpine Presbytery on the topic of 'small church' and what a new way of thinking about how we organise ourselves and where our energy is best directed.

At The Village over the past few years we have experienced the emergence of what could crudely be described as a 'network' of congregations, groups and locations coming into and becoming part of our life. In the wider church scene globally there is a growing amount of literature and content being made public about the idea of 'small' church (*'missional communities', 'micro church'* - to name a couple). Alongside this there seems to be an increasing desire for groups 'on the ground' to have more autonomy and less reliance on the large institution for decision making ability. We are experiencing this in the church as Presbyteries are handling more work and are being more proactive rather than deferring to our national structures. The business world is also experiencing this. I would like to use a block of study leave to explore how we as a parish and as a presbytery can capitalise on what already seems to be happening to the ways that we organise ourselves and direct our energy as people in the 21st Century. Can we reimagine our theology, our organisation, and our mission to best suit this time that we find ourselves in?

Christchurch Men's Prison (0.5 FTE-20 hours per week)

Can you help us show the love of God inside the prison walls? Be willing to support all prisoners with a non-judgemental heart? Support the Department of Corrections' goal of reducing re-offending? Use your ministry skills to coordinate religious services and provide pastoral support?
