A 'Small Church' conversation

As part of my study leave I hope to host a conversation open to anyone in Alpine Presbytery on the topic of 'small church' and what a new way of thinking about how we organise ourselves and where our energy is best directed.

At The Village over the past few years we have experienced the emergence of what could crudely be described as a 'network' of congregations, groups and locations coming into and becoming part of our life. In the wider church scene globally there is a growing amount of literature and content being made public about the idea of 'small' church ('missional communities', 'micro church' - to name a couple). Alongside this there seems to be an increasing desire for groups 'on the ground' to have more autonomy and less reliance on the large institution for decision making ability. We are experiencing this in the church as Presbyteries are handling more work and are being more proactive rather than deferring to our national structures. The business world is also experiencing this. I would like to use a block of study leave to explore how we as a parish and as a presbytery can capitalise on what already seems to be happening to the ways that we organise ourselves and direct our energy as people in the 21st Century. Can we reimagine our theology, our organisation, and our mission to best suit this time that we find ourselves in?

Notes from Presbytery Council

Meeting held 26 April 2022 held on Zoom

Present at the meeting were: Rev Phyllis Harris (Moderator), Maureen Bishop, Rev Rory Grant, Lyn Heine, Ann McMillan, Rev Jon Parkes and Rev Martin Stewart (Executive Officer). There were apologies from Jason King, Brent Richardson, and Christine Arnold.

The Moderator, Rev Phyll Harris, opened the meeting with devotions and prayer.

Devotions:

Phyll reflected on Courage, noting, among other things, that to be in ministry in a postmodern, post-Christian, pandemic, war torn, global warming world takes courage. Even though the writer of Ecclesiastes says there is nothing new under the sun, and every generation have experienced being on a journey that, at times, requires courage of one sort or another. But for those who are called to leadership, it's not just courage needed to get through everyday life with our families, the ups and downs of illness, parenting, teenage years, ageing parents or aging ourselves, it's the added courage we need to front up week by week with a word from God for his people, a word that will turn water to wine, heal the sick, raise the dead....and courage to shoulder the criticism when we fall way short of Jesus in this arena!! And, the courage to lead people forward when we're not even sure which way that is!

But courage doesn't happen in a vacuum, what is the usual catalyst for courage? Interestingly, some research was done around courage, and it was found that "those who don't have the courage to take risks and those who do experience the same amount of fear in life." How might we as a Presbytery face what we fear and not retreat?

Reading Deuteronomy 31: 6-8, Phyll concluded with this sentence, "Let's come to prayer with the words from Karl Barth, 'Courage is fear that has said its prayers.'"

The Minutes of the Presbytery Council meeting held on 24 March 2022 were ratified. The Minutes of the Alpine Presbytery Gathering held on 26th March 2022 be approved.

Executive Officer

Martin reported on a variety of aspects of his work including meeting with various ministers, staff, Doug McConnell (East Side New Mission Seedling), Russell Garrett EO of CPT, Bishop Peter Carrell, and Peter Nelson re the Mission Fund Review.

Meetings included: St Ninians/PSUSI project, PCANZ Insurance Advisory Group (he chairs this), PESC (this is the group established to handle the earthquake settlement process), General Assembly prepping and coaching of the dialogue group process. Plus the usual round of emails seeking advice etc.

It was noted that a team will conduct the ten months in review of the East Side NMS.

Council noted:
