Alpine Presbytery's latest NOM candidate/Intern

Mark Ambundo, who is currently the pastor at Hope West Melton, has been accepted for National Ordained Ministry (NOM) training next year. At the end of May, Mark and his wife Jennifer travelled with Malcolm Bishop, the Presbytery Candidate Co-Convenor, to Auckland to meet with the National Assessment Workgroup (NAW) for a weekend of detailed assessment following Presbytery selection last September. In 2023 Mark will begin an intensive 22-month period of training co-ordinated and led by KCML (the Knox Centre for Ministry and Leadership). This will involve a parish-based internship, block courses, and wider formation study leading to the KCML Diploma in Ministry and national ordination. Originally from Kenya and a graduate in Electrical engineering, Mark has been completing theological studies at Otago while at West Melton and he has a passion for evangelism and teaching.

Since the retirement of Rev Murray Talbot, Mark has been ministering at Hope West Melton, a thriving parish within the Hope network of churches (Hornby, Rolleston, West Melton, and Halkett). He will join Josh Olds at KCML who is the other current Alpine NOM candidate.

We congratulate Mark and wish him every blessing in his formation studies and future ministry.

The Crosses

Sometimes you don't know the significance and deep emotional connection to something until it's not there. In the February 2011 quakes, at St Ninian's, Riccarton, two Oamaru stone Celtic crosses fell down from the highest points of the roof—one at each end. The roof looked bereft. Out of the fragments I was able to construct a life-sized template of exactly what was now ruined. My mate, Noel, a talented pattern-maker, reconstructed the two crosses from lightweight materials in time for me to present them to the congregation as I finished my term of ministry there over 5 years ago now. On Monday, 30th May the replacement crosses were reinstated, to the emotional delight of gathered members of St Ninian's congregation. Both Noel and I were there to see them go up. The church has almost finished its earthquake strengthening and refurbishment, and the crosses have returned—such an amazing wee thing, but it turns out so important to the identity of that wonderful, growing congregation in Riccarton. As several said, the building feels complete again.

Director, Presbyterian Research Centre

The Presbyterian Research Centre (PRC) is part of the Presbyterian Church of Aotearoa New Zealand (PCANZ) and comprises the Hewitson Library and the national Presbyterian Archives. It is located in Knox College in Dunedin.

Our archives tell the story of PCANZ from the early days to the present time. The Hewitson Library holds several special theological collections, available to be borrowed by registered members. Both provide educational, research and information for the benefit of the Church and also the wider community.

The PRC Director is a member of the Presbyterian Church National Service Team that includes staff at the Knox Centre for Ministry and Leadership in Dunedin, and the Finance and Operations Team and the Mission Resourcing Team in Wellington.

The Director will oversee the management of the archives and records of Presbyterian parishes, presbyteries, synods and the national church and affiliated organisations, and also manage the Hewitson Library.

We are looking for a Director who can provide organisational and team leadership, and be a key contributor to the strategic research plan. The position is also responsible for the areas of finance, administration and marketing. The successful applicant will have relevant tertiary and professional qualifications, proven leadership and management experience, and have knowledge and experience in research requirements, and an understanding of the role of e-media.
