Director, Presbyterian Research Centre

The Presbyterian Research Centre (PRC) is part of the Presbyterian Church of Aotearoa New Zealand (PCANZ) and comprises the Hewitson Library and the national Presbyterian Archives. It is located in Knox College in Dunedin.

Our archives tell the story of PCANZ from the early days to the present time. The Hewitson Library holds several special theological collections, available to be borrowed by registered members. Both provide educational, research and information for the benefit of the Church and also the wider community.

The PRC Director is a member of the Presbyterian Church National Service Team that includes staff at the Knox Centre for Ministry and Leadership in Dunedin, and the Finance and Operations Team and the Mission Resourcing Team in Wellington.

The Director will oversee the management of the archives and records of Presbyterian parishes, presbyteries, synods and the national church and affiliated organisations, and also manage the Hewitson Library.

We are looking for a Director who can provide organisational and team leadership, and be a key contributor to the strategic research plan. The position is also responsible for the areas of finance, administration and marketing. The successful applicant will have relevant tertiary and professional qualifications, proven leadership and management experience, and have knowledge and experience in research requirements, and an understanding of the role of e-media.

Notes from Presbytery Council meeting 26 May, held on Zoom

Present at the meeting were: Rev Phyllis Harris (Moderator), Christine Arnold, Maureen Bishop, Rev Rory Grant, Lyn Heine, Jason King, Ann McMillan, Brent Richardson, and Rev Martin Stewart (Executive Officer). There was an apology from Rev Jon Parkes.

The Moderator, Rev Phyll Harris, opened the meeting with devotions and prayer.

Devotions: Phyll reflected on John 21 and the post-resurrection story of Jesus meeting the disciples at the beach, and a walk she experienced on New Brighton beach where she noted the way people harnessed the wind to gather speed on boards and with sails and on a land yacht. Two completely different ways of harnessing the same wind that enabled both to move forward. She also noted that it would be very difficult to navigate and catch the wind as they were without any learning. She observed the need for the church to be agile and wind-blown as it harnesses the way God's Spirit is working and it raised the question where might the church need to be learning to recognise where God's Spirit is at work and having the faith to move with God in that.

In reflecting on this alongside the gospel reading, there was a still a boat needed in this agility, and the characters on it were still fishermen, but it was when they put their nets to the other side as Jesus called, that the change began. To capture the Spirit and hear where Jesus might be calling us to fish churches are needing this kind of agility as they look to opportunities ahead of them. Small churches, in particular, are in a unique place to be agile but for this to happen the systems around them need to be more flexible. What might it look like to cast our nets out the other side?

Brent and Rory identified conflicts of interest in relation to a confidential matter on the agenda and did not participate in the discussion on it.

The Minutes of the Presbytery Council meeting held on 26 April 2022 were ratified, along with endorsement of two email decisions.

The Moderator's Report

Phyll Harris mentioned

- the Covid challenges in her household and the missed opportunity to be at the West Melton opening (the EO was asked to participate in the function)
- the delight of preaching at the Korean Presbyterian Church when they inducted their new elders. This was a significant time for them as they inducted their first woman elder
- her conversations with several people and sending condolence letters to the families of two ministers who had recently died, as well as sending a birthday card to Margaret Coghill of New Brighton Parish as she celebrated her 100th birthday

The Executive Officer Report

Martin Stewart reported on

- a variety of aspects of his work including meetings with various ministers, staff, and church partners, attending General Assembly, and fruitful conversations in the Nelson area and Pleasant Point
- the regulations and opportunities around the 'other recognised ministry' options as listed in Book of Order Chapter 9:45-9.48. A conversation followed

Lyn Heine reported and Council approved

- the membership of the St Margaret's Christchurch MSB of Revs Murray Talbot, Convenor, Jonathon Barb and Judith Souness
- appointing Rev Kathryn Walters (Methodist) as Convenor to the existing MSB at St David's Union Parish, Timaru
- ongoing work on an alternative MSB process in the Presbytery
- approving in principle a study leave request from Rev Brent Richardson for 2023

Property & Finance

Ann McMillan reported and Council approved

- the Alpine Financial Statements for the period ended 30th April 2022
- supporting the Kaiapoi Cooperating Parish request to release remaining Methodist EQ funds of \$10,000 for general use
- seeking an exemption from Church Property Trustees from having an engineering assessment done for the house in one of our churches
- supporting an application from one of our churches for an exemption from upgrading their hall building to 67% NBS
- the building project at Hope Rolleston costing \$6.73 million

Correspondence

- a letter re Eco Church was deferred to the June meeting
- the closure of the Oxford Union Women's Fellowship was noted
- the appointments of Dr Brendan Anstiss and Philip Newton to the Rangi Ruru Board of Governors were approved, and the completion of service of Richard King and Sarah Clarke was noted
