A call for some prayer for the Top of the South/Te Tau Ihu from Alpine Presbytery folk

Hey – as you have seen in the news, the amount of rain across the whole of Te Tauihu has been mind-blowing. State highways that might be shut for a day or so after a major weather event could take a month to open. There may be roads never repaired. So – a few prayers in our direction from the kind folk of Alpine Presbytery will not go amiss.

Things are not simple. i.e. in Whakatū Presbyterian key leadership team there is need for prayer. Currently one teaching elder has bad influenza, (the other younger more handsome teaching elder is good as gold.) The parish clerk currently has covid; another key leader has suffered bereavement of two close whanau in the last few weeks; another elder's house was flooded last weekend; another elder had part of the hillside slip into the back of their house last weekend (see photo); another elder nearly died three weeks ago needing an emergency operation; and another key leader's husband currently has covid. I guess — like in all regions — the list could go on. Please send some prayer and aroha in our direction. What has been good is the community coming together helping each other.
