

# **Thinking about Co-Governance**

For some years, under a concern for how Māori representation may or may not be necessary or desirable on the basis of commitments made under te Tiriti o Waitangi, some local councils have floated the idea of Māori wards and Māori representation on Councils. In some places, this "floating" has resulted in Māori wards being established; in other places, the "floating" has not. In every case, considerable conversation has occurred (some informed, and some not) about co-governance and concerns about how co-governance sits next to the principles of "one person, one vote" democracy.

Given that there is likely to be a lot of community conversation over the next year or so about Co-governance, the new Public Questions Group at Knox Ōtautahi Christchurch did some reading, thinking and writing. The resulting paper can be accessed here:

church should be, it is very well made. Hear this, St David's hasn't had an ordained minister for 35 years! Anne's great wish is to not wreck but add value to an already good thing!

On the side, Anne and I get to live on our Totara Valley property (28mins from Timaru). We live in a wagon-thing in close proximity to each other while the house build progresses (our house used to be a 130 year-old church and it is taking a while to convert!), and with most of our belongings in a storage unit or in our garage. We are glad it is not winter! Around us are early-morning birds (the magpies start first at 4.45am), wide vistas, cows that grunt and moan in the night, thousands of stars in the night-sky, occasional tractors, plants springing back into life, two cats wondering if they have made it to heaven already, and many jobs needing starting or finishing.

Yes, we moved. Don't do it too often though, if you can help it, it is exhausting! The goodbyes, the boxes to pack with stuff that ought to have been sifted, the lugging, the tidying and cleaning, the trips to the dump, the untidiness and chaos of entering a period of prolonged in-betweenness on a building site... it takes it out of you. The exhaustion turned up this week as a chest cold for me. I began acting like the old man I am.

Yesterday, before driving into work, I popped up into the air. 6.5m high on a giant scissor-lift that the builders are using to put up the spouting. Up with the birds! I surveyed the kingdom (actually, the queendom) and, felt giddy — with the fear of height, and with anticipation of all that this arrival means.

I felt alive, despite my hacking cough and Anne calling me to come back to earth. I vow to never move again until I move next time. May it be far, far away, further than the eyes of you and me can see!
