#### Message from the AES on Church investigation into claims of historic abuse

I write concerning a serious and troubling matter that many of you will be aware of from recent media coverage in the Otago Daily Times and the NZ Herald.

On Wednesday 19 October, the Royal Commission to Abuse in Care heard from the Presbyterian Church as part of the responses of faith institutions public hearing.

On the same day, the Commission also heard from some of the Presbyterian Support organisations. The Commission questioned Presbyterian Support Otago (PSO) regarding a witness who alleged that in the 1950s when they were a child residing in PSO's Dunedin Glendining Presbyterian Children's Homes they were the victim of a paedophile ring involving Presbyterian church parishioners. It was revealed during the hearing that PSO had known of these allegations for at least two years and had not reported this to the Church or Police. Separately, there was an allegation that in the 1960s an adult church worker, possibly a minister, abused a teenaged girl.

In addition, PSO spoke at the hearing of files it held for children in their care having been destroyed around the time the Government indicated it would hold a Royal Commission into abuse in care.

The Presbyterian Church did not know of these concerning allegations, nor did our Southern Presbytery. We first heard of them via the Royal Commission.

The sexual abuse of children is criminal behaviour that is completely abhorrent. In response to these troubling allegations, we began planning an independent investigation into the claims of a paedophile ring involving Presbyterian church members in Dunedin.

Terms of Reference have been finalised together with the appointment of a senior King's Counsel as an independent investigator. Once we have permission from the Royal Commission to allow access to material, our investigator can start her work.

As the Presbyterian Church is a separate organisation from PSO, we can only investigate the allegations that relate to the involvement of Presbyterian	Coming Up

### **Advent Resources**


Presbyterian Children and Families have launched a new range of Advent resources, centred around the theme Scripture from Isaiah: "Come, let us walk in the light of the Lord".
