Knox Church, Ōtautahi Christchurch is pleased to be hosting the seminar at 5.00pm on **Sunday 29 January 2023**, in the Hall of the Knox Centre, 28 Bealey Avenue. Entry is free, but any koha would be appreciated.

Anne will discuss why she decided to write Shirley's biography, her sources of information, and some of her interesting discoveries along the way, and the presentation will conclude with a study of two hymns.

# Very Rev Dr Ian Breward

We have been advised of the death of Very Rev Dr Ian Breward in Australia on 30 December 2022.

Ian attended the University of Auckland where he gained a Master of Arts degree in 1957. He then attended the Theological Hall 1958-1960 and, having graduated with a B.D., he was a Commonwealth Scholar and studied in

Manchester, England and obtained a Doctor of Philosophy before returning to New Zealand and was ordained and inducted as Assistant Minister, Knox Church, Dunedin, Dunedin Presbytery in October 1963.

In February 1965, Ian was appointed Professor of Church History at the Theological Hall, Dunedin, staying there until January 1982 when he then took up the position of Professor of Church History, Ormond College, Melbourne. From 2000, Ian served as the archivist of the Synod of Victoria and Tasmania and retired from that in December 2013. In addition to wider roles within the Presbyterian Church—including being a Member of the Council of St. Margaret's College, Dunedin, (1966-1981)—Ian served as Moderator of the General Assembly in 1975. He also served as Deputy Chairman (1976-77) on the Board of Radio New Zealand.

Ian was a fine Church Historian. Our current Moderator – Very Rev Hamish Galloway – was a student at the time Ian was Professor of Church History and writes: "I, like many theological students from that time, remember his impressive intellect, amazing memory and huge capacity for taking in new information. He had an unforgettable presence in the classroom and an ability for keeping students engaged and learning."

Ian published a number of books, including Grace and truth: A history of Theological Hall, Knox College, Dunedin, 1876 -1975 (1975); A History of Australian Churches (1993) and A History of the Churches in Australasia, (2001). 'Mapping the Landscape: Essays in Australian and New Zealand Christianity--Festschrift in Honour of Professor Ian Breward' was published honouring Ian who, for over thirty-five years, had taken a pre-eminent position in mapping the religious landscapes of Australia and New Zealand. In Presbyterians in Aotearoa: 1840 – 1990 (the 150th Anniversary history of the Presbyterian Church in Aotearoa New Zealand) Ian wrote 'Faith is both shaped by historical context and contributes to its shaping' and his contribution was one of mapping and teaching and continuing learning in that space.

A great scholar of international repute, he was elected as a Life Fellow of Knox College in 2006.

We give thanks for lan's life and ministry; and pray for his family.

## Presbyterian Women Aotearoa New Zealand Special General Meeting

Following declining membership of PWANZ in recent years a motion was put at the 2021 AGM that a Futures Review group be formed to consider ways forward for PWANZ as a group. From that group a recommendation was put at the PWANZ AGM on 24 September 2022 that PWANZ be closed down. The following recommendation was moved and accepted by those present at the AGM

**Recommendation:** That Presbyterian Women Aotearoa New Zealand (PWANZ) be closed down. In liaison with the National Executive all Parishes to be notified that their support for our continuing mission in Aotearoa are welcome but the current model of the organisation is unsustainable. The Special Consultative Status with the United Nations Economic and Social Council will lapse.

To progress this recommendation, which has brought up a significant number of issues (outlined below), a <u>Special</u> <u>General Meeting</u> is required, and this will be held <u>on 25 February 2023 at St John's in the City, Wellington.</u>

Issues include:

- Ageing membership & declining finances (currently only 111 financial members)
- Vacancies on Executive (including President)
- How to maintain a woman's voice with the Presbyterian Church, especially at a local level
- Lapsing of Special Consultative Status with the United Nations Economic and Social Council
- Loss of a dedicated missional outlook
