#### Notes from the 26 January 2023 meeting of Presbytery Council held online

**Present at the meeting were:** Rev Jon Parkes (acting in the chair for the Moderator), Christine Arnold, , Lyn Heine, Ann McMillan, Brent Richardson, and Rev Martin Stewart (Executive Officer). There were apologies from Revs Phyll Harris, Rory Grant, & Jason King.

**Devotions:** Jon opened the meeting with devotions based on the writings of a rabbi identifying the importance of living with an attitude of life and a gift and a privilege.

He led a prayer to constitute the meeting.

No one identified any conflicts of interest.

#### **Minutes**

The Minutes of the Presbytery Council meeting held on 13th December 2022 were ratified, and the Minutes of the Extra Meeting of Council on 22nd December 2022 were approved.

#### **The Executive Officer Report**

Martin Stewart reported on

- having a good summer break
- the Induction of Rev Steve Talbot as Lead Pastor at Hope Presbyterian, and the Commissionings of our new Interns: Luke Blackbeard at Timaru Presbyterian, & Jono Lange at Crossway, Christchurch all taking place in morning services on 19 February
- the induction of Rev Martin Harrison at Kaikoura will take place as part of the March Gathering on 4 March (Martin has served as supply minister at Kaikoura for a long time while some issues re the recognition of retirement savings schemes between the Presbyterian and Anglican churches have been ironed out)
- the **Ordination & Induction of Rev Ryan Feng at St Margaret's, Christchurch** is anticipated in March. In the meantime, Ryan will begin in a Stated Supply role at St Margaret's
- attending a 6-day silent retreat in March
- a review of the Hanmer Springs project is about to begin
- ways to better organise the scheduling of performance and position reviews, along with contract and programme reviews and funding applications in a timely manner.

#### **Property & Finance**

Ann McMillan reported and Council approved

- the Alpine Financial Statements for the period ended 31st December 2022
- approve the shortform application from St Ninian's Christchurch, to spend capital property funds of \$42,000 to cover initial costs and a feasibility study re the development of their site working with PSUSI
- it was noted that the material from the CPT re updated Earthquake Policies will be discussed at the Council meeting in February).

#### **Andrew Norton Scholarship**

Approval was given to the application for \$1950 from Rev David Sang-Joon Kim.

The next monthly Council meeting is scheduled for Thursday 23 February at The Village Papanui in Christchurch

The two workshops themes are as follows:

#### 9.00am - 10.00am, Trust and Vulnerability - the dance that grows successful teams

It is common knowledge that trust is essential in creating a cohesive team however, many leaders struggle with exactly how to build trust and the role that vulnerability plays in this. This engaging presentation gives attendees helpful metaphors and language to turn the often-ambiguous concept of 'trust' into practical steps and ways forward aimed at creating productive, transparent, and healthy teams.

10am – 10.30am Morning tea provided

#### 10.30am - 11.30am, Courageous Conversations - talking in the spaces that are uncomfortable

Research shows that being able to engage in tough conversations is a critical component to enable teams and organisations to thrive. It can also be an area where many feel unsure of how to proceed and consequently avoidance, passive aggressive behaviours, and other not so healthy alternatives, can grow instead. This presentation is filled with practical examples and a simple structure that will be useful for all levels of your organisation, helping attendees grow confidence with conversing and stepping into the spaces that are uncomfortable, whether they are part of a team or managing a team.
