## Ministry Vacancy—Knox Church, Dunedin

Knox Church is seeking a full-time National Ordained Minister to be the senior leader in our ministry team. We are seeking a person who will be fully committed to Knox and its people, and who will bring fresh perspectives to our ancient faith as we seek to live faithfully in the 21st century. We are seeking a person with robust theological training, strong preaching, a compassionate heart, and a commitment to social and climate justice. An understanding of the peculiar gifts and challenges of "being Church" in an inner-city and tertiary educational context would be an advantage.

Knox Church is a notable inner-city Presbyterian Church of Aotearoa New Zealand (PCANZ) where a gathered congregation has worshipped since 1876. It is an imposing listed Category 1 heritage building situated at the corner of George and Pitt Streets, and seats up to nine hundred people. Attached to the church building is a gathering and heritage display area. The site includes gardens, and an attractive green space enjoyed by the public. The complex also includes the Knox Church halls, a rental apartment, and a carpark. Knox Church is located at the northern edge of the central business district, along with other important public institutions, including the Dunedin Public Hospital, the University of Otago, and the Otago Polytechnic. Knox Church has a close association with these institutions, and with neighbouring churches.
