# **Rev John Hunt**

Presbytery acknowledges the death of Rev John Hunt. John's funeral service was held in a packed Knox Church in Christchurch and led by Rt Rev Bruce Hansen.

John's ministries were in Te Kuiti and at St Giles in Christchurch where he served for 30 years.

John was a warm-heated pastoral man, a great story-teller, and he had considerable ability to weave a reflective, warm, and earthy spirituality into all that he did. He pointed people to the compelling and embracing love of God. John published three books drawing from his engagement with Celtic spirituality. John recently celebrated 50 years since his ordination.

We offer our love and support to Lesley and their family as they find their way ahead.

## **Summer Servants**

I thought I would write a little something for the ones who might be working or attending to things in our churches during the January summer break. Kia ora!

I'm trying to keep my head down after a few weeks off, and I am finding myself massively distracted by the heat, the associated lack of sleep, and all the things that didn't get done last week! Is it like that for you? I figure that January might be the one month a year where we allow a bit of inefficiency and a choice to work with the rhythms of summer rather than against them. To relax. To waste time. And to glory in it.

Last Sunday I attended worship at Trinity Timaru with my mother – it was her 88<sup>th</sup> birthday. It was good to sit with her among her church family and reflect on the amazing combinations of experiences and opportunities that enabled my mother to reach such an age. It was a time of gratitude. It was also a time of sober reflection: she isn't that well, though the illness is holding off, and I am (still) only 26 years younger than her!

I had found out a few days before that the attending minister had Covid and wasn't able to lead the Sunday service. He had to ask one of his elders to cover the Sunday service *and* a funeral with just an hour and a half's notice!

Lois Shipley was that elder. She led a fine Sunday service including a very creative reflection on the scriptures. I talked with Lois afterwards and thanked her for doing such a fine job with such short notice. Lois was able to draw on her rich experience, she has been preaching and leading worship for over 35 years. That is about as long as I have been

doing it, but her ministry will have received much less acknowledgement, remuneration, or resourcing from the wider church. Lois is a wonderful example of a person living out the commitment of her baptism, she is a treasure in the field of us!

Who steps up when the minister is away? People like Lois do. One or two people gearing up when others have been enjoying their summer break has been a pattern in most of our churches for many years. It is not the glamour season – many people besides the ministers are away making something of the summer break. These can be low days. It is hard to offer a carefully prepared offering to a congregation with many gaps in it. From time-to-time some people even dare to make disparaging comments about church not being 'real' when the minister isn't there. But there is a ministry leader there, a someone like Lois ditching their own need to yield to the heat and the opportunity to zone out, researching and praying and putting thoughts together, and doing a wonderful job of leading the worship of God.

Aren't these people in our life great! What wonders they are! How grateful we are for them!

So here's a cheer from me to them- or to you if you are one of our summer leaders and you are reading this. Can I encourage people to acknowledge these workers among us and make a point of thanking them for their service. They're amazing!

### **Call for Research Participants**

Laidlaw Centre for Church Leadership is working on a research project to support churches in Aotearoa in training more pastors and ministry leaders.

**About the Project:** This project seeks to understand the experiences and challenges faced by emerging leaders called to pastoral ministry in the Christian church in Aotearoa. The aim is to identify barriers to entering pastoral ministry or becoming ordained ministers, so that support can be put in place for potential leaders. By identifying barriers that require support, it also aims to facilitate the training of more pastors/leaders, to address a leadership shortage in Aotearoa. Results from this research will be summarised in a report, which will be distributed by Laidlaw Centre for Church Leadership to pastors and denominational leaders in Aotearoa New Zealand, with the aim of facilitating support.

**Why Participate:** By participating in this survey, challenges and supports can be identified to help identify ways that more pastors and leaders can be trained and supported. Your participation will also support training of ministry leaders for other denominations and churches across Aotearoa.

**How to Participate:** We are looking for anonymous survey responses from three groups of people:

- 1. Pastors/Leaders involved in the process of training new ministry leaders or ordained pastors. We want to hear your experiences of training leaders to identify helpful support systems, potential barriers, and identify what the expectations are for successful ministry leaders in Aotearoa. - Recently ordained pastors / leaders (ordained in the last 5 years) We want to hear the experiences of recently ordained pastors to find out what has been helpful and what has been challenging, so that support can be put in place in the training process. - 3. Those called to ministry who did not complete training processes, or chose to pursue other vocational calls. We want to hear from this group to identify any potential barriers or support needs to help support leaders to train for ministry. Link: <u>https://forms.office.com/r/wVWvm23Rja</u>

We are also looking to interview a small group of people to hear more about their experiences. All surveys will be anonymous. Individuals or churches will not be named.
