Opening of Hope Rolleston—24th **February**

Psalm 100 says...

"Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth.

- ² Worship the Lord with gladness; come before him with joyful songs.
- ³ Know that the Lord is God.
 It is he who made us, and we are his;
 we are his people, the sheep of his pasture.
- ⁴ Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name.
- ⁵ For the Lord is good and his love endures forever; his faithfulness continues through all generations."

If you were to arrive at 565 Springston Rolleston Road and enter through the front doors of the newly finished Hope Rolleston Building, you would see verse four of the above Psalm printed on the glass.

As members of Hope Presbyterian Church, the Selwyn District Council, the Rolleston Community, the Alpine Presbytery, and representatives from the National Church gathered to celebrate the official opening of the Rolleston build, Psalm 100 provided an encouragement, a reminder, and an invitation in how we are called to respond to the goodness of God.

The Psalmist encourages active, joyful, and enthusiastic thanksgiving (shout) for all that God has done. At the same time, he reminds us to find rest (know) in the knowledge of God's sovereignty over all of creation. Finally, the Psalmist invites us

Nelson Church Service for West Coasters


