

Two new seasons of ministry partnership began last week with the induction of Andrew Callander and the ordination of Lyn Heine. Both of the well-attended services were led by Rev Phyll Harris (Presbytery Moderator) and Rev Dale Peach (South Island Methodist Synod Superintendent).

Rev Dr Andrew Callander was inducted at St Andrew's Uniting Church in Motueka on Tuesday 30th April. Andrew had been the stated supply minister since February. His previous ministry had been in New Plymouth., and prior to ministry he had been an educator. His PhD is in Systematic Theology. Andrew was the guest speaker at the 2023 General Assembly.

Rev Lyn Heine was ordained at Greymouth & Districts Uniting Church on 3 May. Lyn has served in ministry leadership

at Greymouth for nearly 20 years—firstly as a member of a Local Ministry Team and latterly as a Local Ordained Ministry probationer. Lyn also serves on the Presbytery Council as the Human Resources convener. She previously worked as an occupational therapist.

Notes from the April meeting of Presbytery Council held on 2 May 2024 on Zoom

Present at the meeting were: Rev Phyll Harris (Moderator), Rev Brent Richardson, Rev Jonathan Barb, Rev Rory Grant, Lyn Heine, Rev Jason King, Ann McMillan, Rev Lynmaree Sopoaga, Keith Christie (Treasurer) and Rev Martin Stewart (Executive Officer).

Welcome & Devotions: Phyll welcomed everyone and shared a reading from Ecclesiastes 3, reflecting on season changes and challenges and how it is important to reflect at macro and micro levels. This was followed by a time of shared reflections.

Phyll constituted the meeting with prayer.

Conflicts of Interest: None were identified.

Minutes: The Minutes of the Presbytery Council meeting held on Thursday 28th March 2024 had been approved by email and were ratified at the meeting.

Risk Management As usual, a discussion was held in private on matters of risk.

Moderator's Report

Phyll commented on several things:

- The Gathering seemed to go very well.
 - Dan and Abi led well with a great team effort in the absence of Martin. It was also very good to have our national moderator Rose Luxford with us and be alongside in leading devotions and communion.
 - St. Margarets provided wonderful hospitality, including catering out from their new kitchen facility. They were very mindful of honouring Mary Stanton and her great contribution to the kitchen that they were now working in.
 - The Elders session on Thursday night was very well attended. Andrew Nicol from KCML led an in-depth session.
 - Feedback around content of the Gathering was positive. Some questions were asked that will need further response.
 - It was interesting to notice that most people were present for the Friday night and Saturday morning.
 - It was good to have an opportunity to hear about Rory's study leave and I appreciated the opportunity to speak to mine. Could we offer this more going forward?
- Conversations with Martin, Megan Waddington as she finished at PSUSI.
 - Meeting with Wayne Matheson and others thinking about the organisation of General Assembly 2025.
- Preparation for the induction of Andrew Callender to St Andrew's Uniting Motueka and Lyn Heine's ordination at Greymouth Uniting. And a visit to Takaka.
- Sympathy to Rev Alistair McNaughton on the loss of Catherine.

Zoom, EOs, (including a 3 day Gathering at Hanmer Springs), prep for the induction & ordination services, Insurance Group, working with Plains and other churches.

- Jess Dreadon has completed her training as a LOM and been signed off by KCML and the Candidate Convener (Michael Reid). Her ordination is scheduled for Sunday 26 May, 7pm at Hope Rolleston.
- Akaroa-Banks Peninsula A long process is leading towards an agreement formalising the joining of the Anglican and Presbyterian Churches as a 'Community Church.' It will be a joint venture between the Presbytery and Diocese. The initial ministry to be under Presbyterian oversight. This is still being finalised.
- Overview of the Presbytery Martin presented a paper and power point looking at the churches of the Presbytery with commentary.
- St Andrew's in Blenheim Marion Rowe has resigned and finished in her ministry leader role and as Interim Moderator. Dan is working with people. The Parish Clerk is also finishing in her role this year because of health issues. Presbytery is offering support.
- Plains Parish Good progress is being made on exploring a new way of working in the area.
- St Albans Uniting Are now asking for a Presbyterian MSB process.
- **Gathering follow-up** Martin to prepare answers to the questions people asked and send around Council before circulating. A discussion was held on Presbytery Staffing level comparisons and the Gathering quorum issue which will be looked at the July planning day.

Property & Finance

Ann McMillan shared key aspects of the report, including,

- **MEF update**: in **most** cases a parish will have to give express approval before a deduction would be made. The churches/Presbytery will need to make a decision at the time of requesting approval for the sale of a property; we suspect most will not give approval for the deduction and that Presbytery would support that decision.
- Updates on projects/ building issues etc:
 - a. Pleasant Point Property: the progress on the feasibility study is imminent.
 - b. Waihao Glenavy Community Church: the seed funding of \$10,000 from the Waimate Cooperating funds has been paid to the new entity.
 - c. Ellesmere new hall build is progressing.
 - d. Plains sale of Carew land completed.
 - e. Awatere use of capital funds approved by CPT.
 - f. Hope Hornby strengthening approved by CPT.
 - g. St Ninians modifications of lounges approval to CPT for confirmation.
 - h. Approval of the sale of the Hoon Hay manse.

Human Resources

Lyn Heine shared key aspects of the report, including,

- Confirmation of the MSB for The Village Bryndwr led by Rev Hamish Galloway
- Rev David Coster as IM at The Village.
- Rev Anne Stewart as IM for Waihao/Glenavy.
- Approval of study leave application from Rev Sage Harris.

General Business

 Supporting the extension of the current appointment of Rev Dawn Baldwin at the Amuri Cooperating Venture for a further five years full-time subject to confirmation of her consent.

Orders of the Day

- #1 Call to Rev Robert Robati-Mani to Hurunui (Kowai/Cheviot-Waikari) Churches for an initial 5-yr full-time position. This is subject to confirmation of the call from Southern Presbytery.
- #2 Call to Rev Josh Olds to Mission Lead at The Village Papanui. Josh has been serving in a stated supply role until this call was processed through an MSB.
