What is a wānanga?

Wānanga: A space for open discussion, for gathering together to discuss different thoughts, opinions and experiences.

In te ao Māori, te wānanga is the traditional space where knowledge is gained and exchanged. It is a very Māori way of learning – to seek to come to a deeper understanding of the matters that are discussed, but not necessarily needing to come to an outcome or to result in a decision being made. **Wānanga are spaces where differences are welcomed.**

This wananga is open to ministers, elders, and others who are serving in your parish. We hope that it will be a space where we can get to know each other better, engage with different ideas and learn together!

John England Memorial Activist Award

This is an annual award for an individual or group that is involved in a significant activist activity of benefit to the community or a particular organisation. The award commemorates the long-standing activism of the Rev Dr John England who died in 2021. John was a founding member of EcuAction, an interfaith Canterbury based action group, and despite his declining health, John consistently pushed EcuAction into considering and working on cutting edge priorities such as climate change and taxation reform.

This annual award will consist of a framed EcuAction certificate presented at a publicly arranged event at which the award winner will be invited to speak.

E3 Wilderness Expeditions: 10-21 Dec 2024 E3 is a partnership between Scripture Union NZ, Adventure Specialties Trust and

A Rocha Aotearoa NZ. For Years 12-13 in 2024. Travelling as a small community through remote wilderness areas of Aotearoa New Zealand, each expedition is focused on developing the character of participants and strengthening their connections with God, others, and creation.

Each journey looks different:

- * In **Canterbury**, tramp through the Lewis Pass high country and undertake a multi-day rafting expedition down the Waiau Toa/Clarence River.
- * In **Otago**, scale alpine passes in Aspiring National Park and sea-kayak across Lake Wanaka.
- * In **Central North Island**, the journey travels through Tongariro and Whanganui National Parks from the mountains to the Tasman Sea.
- * At the **Bay of Islands**, we embrace the history of Aotearoa by beginning at Waitangi, journeying around the Bay of Islands, and ending at Whananaki.
