

Mayfield Trust

On Wednesday 20 November, Annette Syme from Staveley and Liz Depree from Rakaia represented Three Peaks Mission (ex Plains Presbyterian Parish) at a celebration in Mayfield Trinity Church organised by the Mayfield Trust. The

Trust was formed over 60 years ago as a fundraising arm of the Mayfield Church. The Trustees were members of local farming families, many of whom were church members. They aimed to raise funds from excess farm produce, but the majority of the funds came from farmers donating one or two calves to be raised on farms, which were then sold off at a profit when they matured. This innovative scheme was well supported not only by church members but others in the Mayfield district. Regular annual donations were distributed to Mayfield Trinity Church and subsequently, Plains Presbyterian Parish once Mayfield, Methven and Rakaia were amalgamated. Donations were also given to other community organisations where needs had been identified.

Current Trustees have decided to wind up the Trust, partly because of the downturn in farming and the challenges faced by Mycoplasma Bovis but also because of the requirements to re-register the Trust as a Charity. A special morning tea was organised to bring together groups that were chosen to benefit from the distribution of the remaining funds. The largest recipient is Three Peaks Mission, with the proviso that the money be

used for Ministry rather than buildings. Other recipients are Presbyterian Support, Hato Hone St Johns, Mayfield and Mt Somers Fire Brigade, Westpac Helicopter, Opuke Wellbeing, Mayfield Playcentre, Mt Somers/Staveley Playcentre and Peel Forest Preschool.

The Mayfield Trust has had a long story that needs to be told and acknowledged. People of the land often 'do church' in different ways and this is an example of an amazing form of the community undergirding the ministry of their local church.

Three Peaks Mission gives thanks for this generous donation, and assures the Trust, that it will be wisely used to further its mission of outreach into their communities.
