Presbytery Gathering: 9 –10 May 2025

It would be really good if Ministers and Presbytery Elders could note these dates and aim to be there next year. It has been a while since we had a good turnout at a Gathering.

The big topics for discussion and decision at the Gathering are working on the Presbytery Strategy (we update these every 3-4 years), formally establishing the Enterprise Fund, adopting the Budget, electing several new members of Presbytery Council, reflecting on options for the future at Hanmer Springs after a season of seedling ministry, and inducting a new Presbytery Moderator (nominations are now open). Material about the major decision streams will be circulated well-before we gather.

Our **guest speaker** is Dr Andrew Root from the United States – he is an engaging speaker and writer with a particular focus on how to do and be church in this season of decline. There will be room for any interested people to come along to the sessions when he is speaking.

St Andrew's Ashburton 150th celebrations

On Sunday 1st December, approximately 140 people gathered to celebrate 150 years of St Andrew's Presbyterian Church in Ashburton.

We were joined by the Ashburton Pipe Band (it was also a celebration of St Andrew's Day).

The highlight of morning tea was the cutting of the cake by the two eldest members of the congregation, Alyth Melrose and Mervyn Jones (see photo at right).

There was also a wonderful display of photos portraying the life of St Andrew's, as well as newspaper clippings, and a display of a wedding dress and christening gown (worn by people who were married and baptised in St Andrew's church).

A short history of the Presbyterian church in Ashburton:

In the early days of European settlement at Ashburton church services were infrequent. When a minister visited people of all denominations would gather - on the riverbank, at the hotel, in the wool shed at Coniston or, later, in a schoolroom or the library.

In July 1874 a meeting was held in order to establish a Presbyterian parish in the town.A suitable residence, along with 10 acres of land, was purchased for use as a manse. The Rev. H. B. Burnett was inducted as minister of St Andrew's, Ashburton, on the 15th September 1875. Work began on the construction of a church on Havelock Street (now the "white church") which was opened in October 1876.

The Rev. Burnett had a busy preaching circuit. His parish covered the area between the Rakaia and Rangitata Rivers, from the hills to the sea. He would ride his horse to Mt. Somers on Saturday afternoon, hold a service there at 11am, Greenstreet at 3pm, and Ashburton at 6.30pm. Ashburton had a service every Sunday except the last Sunday of the month when he preached at Rakaia at 11am, Rokeby Station at 3pm and Winterslow Station in the evening. Another Sunday the sequence would be Ashburton, Wakanui, Longbeach.

Finances were tight and Rev. Burnett frequently had to remind the committee that quarterly payments of his 250 pounds per annum stipend were in arrears.

Over the next 30 years the town of Ashburton grew and, even though some of the outlying areas now had their own parishes, the St Andrew's church building had become too small. Our present church was dedicated on the 23rd June 1907.

A Bible was presented to the congregation by members of the Sunday School, and this is the Bible that is carried into church today.
