Current Members:

Rev Jonathan Barb, Keith Christie, Rev Lyn Heine (via Zoom), Rev Jason King, Ann McMillan, Rev Brent Richardson, Rev Lynmaree Sopoaga and Rev Phyll Harris (Moderator). The Executive Officer is an ex-officio member.

Recent changes:

Jon Parkes stood down in 2024.

Rev Rory Grant has taken up a call in Clevedon. Rory was on Council by virtue of being Resourcing Convener.

Jason King has indicated he will step down.

Also, Rev Lynmaree Sopoaga is taking up the position of Moderator for two years.

The vacancies on Council are as follows:

As a Chaplain at Burwood Hospital, Sandra Wright-Taylor is often asked by clergy and parish pastoral workers/visitors about how they might work more effectively with people with dementia and their carers. After several conversations with specialist staff at Burwood Hospital, who like her work closely with dementia patients, there is to be a workshop on dementia for church and pastoral leaders.

Programme:

Dementia and Delirium 101: Dr Susan Gee is the Lead Researcher for Psychiatry of Old Age, Te Whatu Ora, Waitaha/Canterbury. Susan has PhD in Psychology from the University of Otago, and a Masters of Gerontology from Kings College, London.

Dementia and Spiritual Care: Rev Sandra Wright-Taylor is Chaplain to Older Persons Mental Health, Burwood Hospital and Regional Manager, Te Waipounamu, Hospital Chaplaincy Aotearoa. Sandra's thesis for her Master of Chaplaincy (Otago) will focus on Spiritual Care and Dementia.
