Present at the meeting were: Rev Phyll Harris (Moderator), Rev Jonathan Barb, Keith Christie, Rev Lyn Heine, Rev Jason King, Rev Brent Richardson, Rev Lynmaree Sopoaga, and Rev Martin Stewart (Executive Officer). Christine Arnold attended the last part of the meeting on behalf of the Property & Finance Team.

An apology was received from Ann McMillan.

Welcome & Devotions

Phyll shared of an experience meeting a woman who was studying the power of poetry as part of the healing process for domestic abuse survivors. The woman, who had lost her son and almost her own life to a domestic violence attack had identified how important a retreat and counselling space had been in her

recovery. Phyll shared a reading from Isaiah 53 – 'the suffering servant' noting that God calls us to return and return again in times of dysfunction. Phyll led the meeting in prayer.

Risk Management

As usual, a discussion was held in private on matters of risk.

Moderator's Report

Phyll reported on

- love and sympathy go to Martin and Anne on the loss of Martin's mum
- met with Dan Spragg at the end of last month to connect with the work he is up to in fulfilling his call to Kaihautu Whakatipu - Ministries Coordinator a year down the track
- met with Abi Trevathan to talk through ideas around the upcoming sexuality korero on the evening before the May Gathering
- missed the opening of Pá Whakaoranga due to being sick
- the honour of attending the closing church service for St. Kentigern's (Burwood Uniting), a poignant occasion led by Rev Bob Reid. The service brought together individuals from both the past and present, symbolizing the enduring connections formed over the years. Chris Gee (Parish Clerk) played a pivotal role in bringing this together.

The Executive Officer Report

Martin reported on several aspects of his work including reports from Abi (Kairuruku Whanake), and Dan (Kaihautū Whakatipu)

- gratitude for the room given to attend to the death of his mum Aileen
- his intention to attend the UCANZ Forum 'Our Future Together' at Kings Birthday
- attending the wonderful opening of Pā Whakaoranga in Aranui
- Revs Rose Luxford and Wayne Matheson will be attending the Gathering. We will have the opportunity to acknowledge Wayne is in his last year as AES and Rose in the last 6 months of her leadership as PCANZ Moderator
- the intention to have the key papers for the Gathering out by 21 April including Mission Framework draft, Budget, key reports & Enterprise Fund structure
- working on guidelines around the culture and tone of the Gathering that we invite people to honour and respect including asking questions ahead of time as much as possible
- the idea of starting a little tradition at the Autumn Gatherings where a small number of our elders or key leaders are recognised for their service
- arranging the voting process to enable the Presbytery members to vote on the nominated person as Moderator-elect of Alpine Presbytery, Rev Aunty Lyn Sopoaga
- Dan Spragg prepared a short report one year into his role
- Abi Trevathan reported
- on the opportunity to seek Forge funding from PressGo to be pursued (see recommendation)
- exploring a 'Third Culture' seedling possibility in Christchurch (the children of expatriates tend to develop a culture that was a blend of both their parents' culture and the culture that they were growing up in)
 Key Decision
- That Presbytery applies for funding from PressGo on behalf of Forge Aotearoa

Community Church of Akaroa Banks Peninsula MSB Report & Call to Rev Pauline Hampshire

Members of the MSB Simon Lints, Sue Church, and Annette Moore joined the meeting via Zoom along with Pauline Hampshire.

An MSB Report had been prepared and circulated by the convener Martin Stewart. Sue, Annette and Simon spoke very warmly of the process, giftings of Pauline and unanimous congregational vote to call Pauline.

Pauline also shared her positive feelings about the opportunity and the sense of God's call.

Key Decision:

That Rev Pauline Hampshire be called to be the minister at the Community Church of Akaroa Banks Peninsula.

The Moderator asked Pauline if she would be willing to accept the call. Pauline replied affirmatively.

General Business

a) Presbytery Council membership

Discussion was held on filling vacancies on Presbytery Council and seeking nominations of suitable people to serve on other teams.

Current Members: Rev Jonathan Barb, Keith Christie, Rev Lyn Heine, Rev Jason King, Ann McMillan, Rev Brent Richardson, Rev Lynmaree Sopoaga,

Rev Jon Parkes resigned in 2024.

Rev Rory Grant has recently departed. Rory was on Council by virtue of being Resourcing Convener.

Jason King has indicated he will step down.

Phyll Harris is finishing as Moderator.

Aunty Lyn is the nomination for Moderator-elect.

It was agreed that there be a general call for nominations or expressions of interest for the vacant Council positions with a view to Council bringing names to the Gathering for election. Noting that the ability to function well in a governance board with the ability to manage confidentiality is a must.

Vacancies: Minister from Nelson/Marlborough, Minister from Christchurch area, Elder from Mid-Sth Canterbury, and the possibility of a young-adult representative. Martin will initiate a nomination process.

b) Pleasant Point Report

It is two years since the closure of the parish and the support arrangement managed by Timaru Presbyterian continues. It was agreed that a grant for future oversight at Pleasant Point be made to Timaru Presbyterian Church.

c) University Chaplaincy Support

Jonathan Barb & Martin Stewart will take the idea of various local parishes supporting the chaplaincy to the May Gathering
