Farewell to Gail

After nearly 11 years, Gail Weaver has finished in her role as Office Support for Alpine Presbytery.

She was appointed when the Presbytery first came together from the five Presbyteries previously representing the upper parts of the South Island, with the original intention being that it be a two-year appointment to get admin systems in place. 11 years later she was still here!

Gail tells us that there have been some really good experiences working with some of the people in the Presbytery, and that she enjoyed stretching herself by learning new systems (she used Professors Google and YouTube to learn how to set up our first database using Access Database) and upgrading her abilities in others, such as Infoodle.

With changes in personnel and priorities around the Presbytery, as well as her husband retiring, she decided it was time to step back, although she will be continuing in her role at Cashmere Presbyterian Church (where she has been for 23 years) for the foreseeable future.

Gail gave us her notice at the end of March and we are now starting to look for her replacement.

The ordination and induction of **Rev Pauline Hampshire** as well as the formal recognition of the new Community Church will be held at Trinity Presbyterian Church in Akaroa at 3.30pm on Sunday 29 June followed by a light tea.



The Church in Aotearoa New Zealand

A 10 week explotoration of the history of Christianity and the Church in Aotearoa New Zealand



This fascinating course will be offered by Zoom on either a Tuesday or Thursday evening commencing in July. Each session will be about 90 minutes.

The cost is \$90 which includes a copy of "Christianity in Aotearoa" and the 70 page study guide.

The content of the course is:

Unit One: Māori and Christianity (2 weeks)

Unit Two: Settler Christianity (2 weeks)

Unit Three: Church and Society (3 weeks)

Unit Four: Challenge and Change (3 weeks)

The course consists of individual reading (2 to 3 hours) followed by a seminar group. Normally these have been 2 hours when done in-person but with Zoom we have found that can be a little long and we try to complete the seminar sessions in 1½ hours.

The timing would be negotiated with the mentor and group members.
